### **PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING OVERALL REQUIREMENTS**

- 1) To fulfill requirements for the minor in French Area & Culture Studies, a minimum of 19 credits of course work must be earned.
- 2) A minimum of 9 upper division credits with a letter grade must be taken in residency at WSU, or through WSU-approved education/study abroad or educational exchange courses: *WSU Rule #54*.
- 3) Language Conversation courses (105, 205, 305) do not count toward the minor.
- 4) Only courses designated in the Catalog may be repeated for credit toward the minor.
- 5) All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better.
- 6) For course equivalencies taken in an approved Education/Study Abroad program or as other transfer credits, please check with your foreign language undergraduate advisor.

### **DEPARTMENTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT**

#### *FOR EXAMPLE:*

Take FREN 102 (Second Semester French) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 102

PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 101

TOTAL 8 credits

Take FREN 203 (Third Semester French) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 203

PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102

PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 101

TOTAL 12 credits

Take FREN 204 (Fourth Semester French) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 204

PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 203

PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102

TOTAL 12 credits
