SPECIAL NOTES FOR THE GERMAN PROFESSIONS 2ND MAJOR:

- Students must take TWO Writing in the Major (M) courses.
- No course in which a C- or lower grade is earned will be counted toward the major; pass/fail courses do not count in the major.
- No course may be repeated for credit toward both the major and German Area Studies minor.
- Of the 34 credits required for the major, at least 15 must be taken in residence at WSU. These 15 credits may not be earned using advanced placement or challenge exam credit. Six (6) of these 15 credits in residence must be at the upper division-level.
- Credits of 105/205/305/405 may not be applied towards the major or minor.
- A maximum of 12 credits per semester OR 18 credits per two semesters may be transferred from study abroad.
- **THE GERMAN PROFESSIONS MAJOR IS A 2ND MAJOR ONLY, CANNOT BE USED AS A 2ND DEGREE.**

DEPARTMENTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

FOR EXAMPLE:

Take GERMAN 102 (Second Semester German) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 102

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 101

TOTAL 8 credits

Take GERMAN 203 (Third Semester German) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 203

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 102

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 101

TOTAL 12 credits

Take GERMAN 204 (Fourth Semester German) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 204

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 203

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 102

TOTAL 12 credits

Take GERMAN 307 or 308 (Intermediate German) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 307 or 308

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 204

PLUS 4 AP credits for GER 203

TOTAL 12 credits
