PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING OVERALL MINOR REQUIREMENTS

- 1) Half of the credits required for the minor must be in upper-division courses.
- 2) A minimum of 9 upper division credits with a letter grade must be taken in residency at WSU, or through WSU-approved education/study abroad or educational exchange courses: *WSU Rule #54*.
- 3) 101-102 is the WSU language requirement and cannot count toward the minor.
- 4) Language Conversation courses (105, 205, 305) do not count toward the minor.
- 5) Only courses thus designated in the Catalog may be repeated for credit toward the minor.
- 6) All courses taken for the minor must be passed with a grade of C or better.
- 7) Courses counting towards a minor in the language may not also be counted towards a major in International Area Studies (i.e. European Area Studies, Latin America Area Studies, German Area Studies, or French and Francophone Area Studies).
- 8) For course equivalencies taken in an approved Education/Study Abroad programs or as other transfer credits, please check with your language undergraduate advisor.
- 9) For the special minor requirements in the French Area Studies, Spanish Peninsular and Latin American, and German Area Studies, please see the language area undergraduate advisor.

DEPARTMENTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

FOR EXAMPLE:

Take RUSSIAN 102 (Second Semester Russian) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 102 PLUS 4 AP credits for RUS101
TOTAL 8 credits

Take RUSSIAN 203 (Third Semester Russian) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 203
PLUS 4 AP credits for RUS102
PLUS 4 AP credits for RUS 101
TOTAL 12 credits

Take RUSSIAN 204 (Fourth Semester Russian) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 204
PLUS 4 AP credits for RUS 203
PLUS 4 AP credits for RUS 102
TOTAL 12 credits
