SPECIAL NOTES FOR THE SPANISH PROFESSIONS 2ND MAJOR:

- Students must take TWO Writing in the Major (M) courses: Spanish 308 and/or two writing in the major courses from the student's first major.
- No course in which a C- or lower grade is earned will be counted toward the major; pass/fail courses do not count in the major.
- No course may be repeated for credit toward the major and the Latin American Area Studies minor.
- Of the 33/34 credits required for the major, at least 15 must be taken in residence at WSU. These 15 credits may not be earned using advanced placement or challenge exam credit. Six (6) of these 15 credits in residence must be at the 400-level.
- Credits of 105/205/305/405 may not be applied towards the major or minor.
- A maximum of 12 credits per semester OR 18 credits per two semesters may be transferred from study abroad.
- **THE SPANISH PROFESSIONS MAJOR IS AN ADDITIONAL MAJOR ONLY, CANNOT BE USED AS A 2ND DEGREE.**

DEPARTMENTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT

Starting in a course higher than 101 for your first language class at WSU? You may be eligible for departmental advanced placement credit. Check out the Departmental Advanced Placement Credits, and see the Languages advisor for details: <https://www.slcr.wsu.edu/>

FOR EXAMPLE:

Take SPAN 102 (Second Semester Spanish) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 102 PLUS 4 AP credits for SPAN 101

TOTAL 8 credits

Take SPAN 204 (Fourth Semester Spanish) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 204 PLUS 4 AP credits for SPAN 203 PLUS 4 AP credits for SPAN 102

TOTAL 12 credits

Take SPAN 306 or 307 or 308 (Intermediate Spanish) & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 204 PLUS 4 AP credits for SPAN 203 PLUS 1 AP credit for SPAN 305

TOTAL 1 credits
