**REQUIREMENT:  
PROFICIENCY EXAM-

Language majors and minors are required to take an exit proficiency exam in the term in which they are enrolled in their last course of the major or minor. This exam is not graded, nor is the attainment of a certain level required, but is a requirement to determine each student's language proficiency level. This exam requires a fee. 1. To fulfill requirements for a minor in French, a student must complete a minimum of 19 credits of course work in one language area.
2. A foundation of the target language, 102, 203 and 204 or 261 (10 credits), is required. The remaining 9 credits must be 300-400-level course work in the target language, of which 3 credits must be taken in residence at WSU, while the remaining 6 credits must be taken either in residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad, educational exchange courses, or equivalent transfer coursework.
3. All courses must be passed with a grade of C or better.
4. Only courses designated in the Catalog may be repeated for credit toward the minor.
5. 105, 205, 305, 405 – Conversation Courses - do not count towards the minor.
6. For courses taken in Study Abroad Programs or as other transfer credits, please check with your advisor.
7. All Language Minors must also complete an exit proficiency examination during the semester in which they complete the last language course of their minor. There is a fee charged for the exam.

**DEPARTMENTAL ADVANCED PLACEMENT CREDIT**

**FOR EXAMPLE:**

Take FREN 102 (Second Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 4 credits for 102 PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN101  
TOTAL 8 credits

Take FREN 203 (Third Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 3 credits for 203 PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102  
PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 101  
TOTAL 11 credits

Take FREN 204 (Fourth Semester French) & get a B or better  
Earn 3 credits for 204 PLUS 3 AP credits for FREN 203  
PLUS 4 AP credits for FREN 102  
TOTAL 10 credits
