PROFICIENCY EXIT EXAM:

REQUIREMENT: PROFICIENCY EXAM-STAMP 4S

Language majors and minors are required to take an exit proficiency exam at the end of the academic term in which they are enrolled in their last course for the minor. This exam is not graded, nor is the attainment of a certain level required, but is a requirement to determine the student's language proficiency level at the completion of their language studies at WSU. PLEASE NOTE THE FOLLOWING OVERALL REQUIREMENTS

- 1) The minor in Spanish Language Translation requires completion of a minimum of 18 credits, 9 of which must be upper-division and taken in residence at WSU or through WSU-approved education abroad or educational exchange courses, plus the Spanish exit proficiency (STAMP) exam.
- 2) A grade of B or better is required in all courses that apply to the minor.

Take SPAN 102 (Second Semester Spanish & get a B or better

Earn 4 credits for 102

Receive 4 AP credits for SPAN 101

TOTAL 8 credits

Take SPAN 203 (Third Semester Spanish) & get a B or better

Earn 3 credits for 203

Receive 4 AP credits for SPAN 102

Receive 4 AP credits for SPAN 101

TOTAL 11 credits

Take SPAN 204 (Fourth Semester Spanish) & get a B or better

Earn 3 credits for 204

Receive 3 AP credits for SPAN 203

Receive 4 AP credits for SPAN 102

TOTAL 10 credits
